Present tense	Present tense
For automatic or habitual events both the if & main clauses are in the present tense	
If you heat	water to 100°, it boils.
<b>Type 1: If I find your passport, I'll post it to you.</b>	
•Present tense •Present continuous •Present perfect	•Future tense •May / can •Command
If clause generally refers to the future even though it is in the present tense	
If you feel cold (now), I'll shut the window.	
<b>Type 2: If I knew his number, I would ring him.</b>	
•Past Simple •Past Continuous •Past Simple	•Would + Infinitive •Might •Could •Would + continuous infinitive
If clause refers to an unreal past and expresses doubt or uncertainty	
If anyone tried to break in,	the alarm went off.
Past simple	Past simple
<b>Type 3: If he had been in his office, I would have seen him.</b>	
•Past perfect •Perfect Continuous	•Would + Perfect Infinitive •Might •Could
If clause refers to a past that did not happen	
•Had (Formal) Had he been in his office, I would have seen him.
