Object Questions (The question word refers to the object that receives the action of the verb) (we want to know about the receiver of the action.)

"Am I asking about the **doer** of the action or the **receiver** of the action?"

If you're asking about the **doer/subject**, then DON'T use ~~do/does/did~~. subject Q

If you're asking about the **receiver/object**, then YES – use do/does/did. Object Q


