Seek vs search
object of <i>seek</i> is the item you are trying to locate, whereas the object of <i>search</i> is the place you are looking in. E.g.: I will seek my true love in this club. I will search this club for my true love. Also, <i>seek</i> implies that the seeker knows that the item they are looking for does exist. <i>Search</i> has no such implication.
seek verb FORMAL 1 to try to find or get something, especially something which is not a physical object: "Are you actively seeking jobs?" she asked. Hundreds of dissidents are seeking refuge/asylum in the US embassy. 2 to ask for advice, help, approval, permission, etc: Legal advice should be sought before you take any further action.
