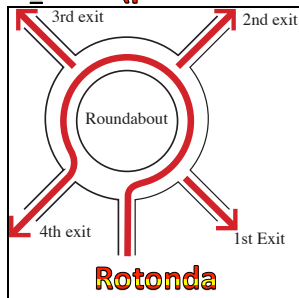

live in or at a specified place.

"groups of gypsies still dwell in these caves"

a dwelling (la vivienda)

a house, flat, or other place of residence.

"the proposed dwelling is out of keeping with those nearby"

To dwell on (preocuparse por)

To (not) be bothered

I can't be bothered doing / to do my homework.

(no tener ganas)

I'm not bothered about it. (≈preocupado)

To bother

worry

"Don't bother about me—I'll find my own way home"

annoy

"I'm sorry to bother you at this time of night"

to take the time to do something "I rarely bother to wash the dishes."

To backup your information.

(copia de seguridad)

To make/do a backup.

We need a backup plan.

How did it turn out? (como acabo) / end up (acabar)

Was there a big gay turn out? go somewhere in order to attend a meeting, vote, play in a game, etc.

To narrow (estrecho) it down. (concretar/ eliminar)
