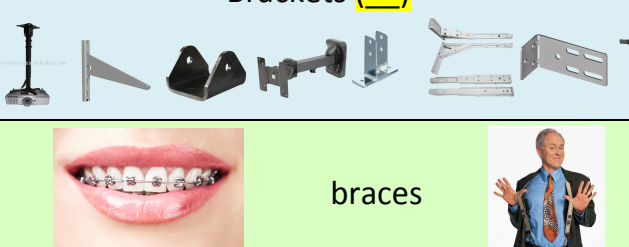

4 Some adjectives have the form of the past or present participle.

- -ed (past participle) adjectives describe our reaction to something/someone:

*I was very **bored** with/by the play.*

- -ing (present participle) adjectives describe the thing/person/event/experience that causes the reaction:

*The play was very **boring**.*

Other common pairs of participle adjectives include:

amused/amusing, annoyed/annoying, depressed/depressing, disappointed/disappointing, excited/exciting, interested/interesting, terrified/terrifying, tired/tiring

5 In two-part adjectives the second part is often a participle, e.g.:

well-known, beautifully-dressed, time-consuming

glamarous
