Relative Clauses	
Defining relative clause (Gives us essential information about the subject.)	
It was the man that spoke really quickly.	
Use: that /which /who + 0 commas(,)	
You can omit the pronoun if there is a subject before the main verb:	
The film (which/that) we saw was three hours long.	
The person (that) I know is	
He is the person that does the work.	
NON-Defining relative clause	
(Gives NON-essential information about the subject.)	
Use: that /which/who etc.... + 2 commas(, ,)	
My mum, who lives in Britain, likes [biskits] biscuits.	
My phone, that which is 5 years old, doesn't work.
