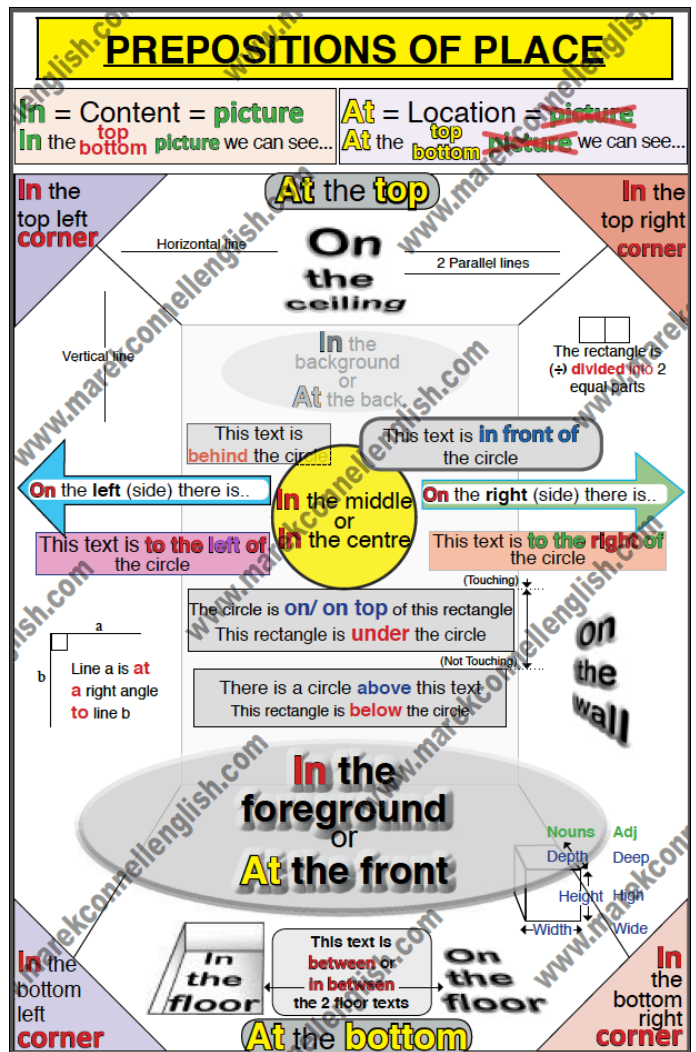
To be gang-ho (is an English term used to mean "enthusiastic" or "overzealous")
