

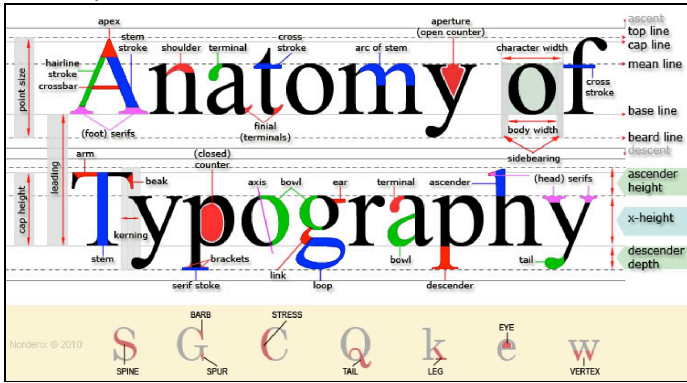

 Incorrect: Tom handed in **it**. I took off **them**.
