

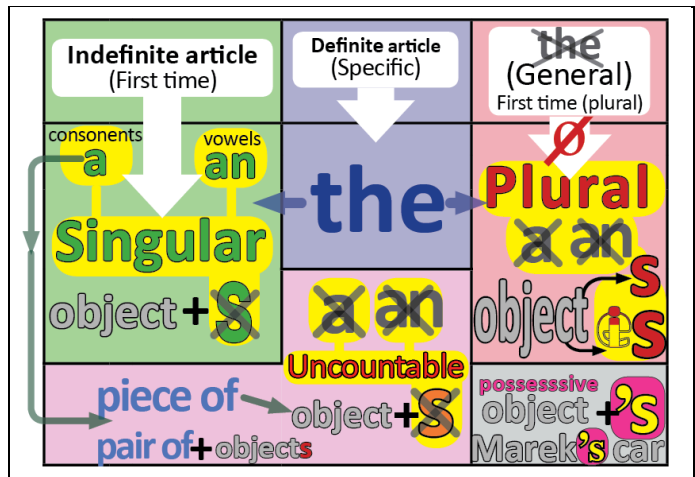

Correct: Tom handed it in. I took them off.
 Incorrect: Tom handed-in it. I took-off them.
