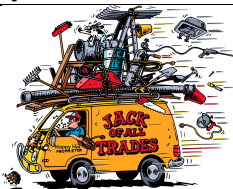

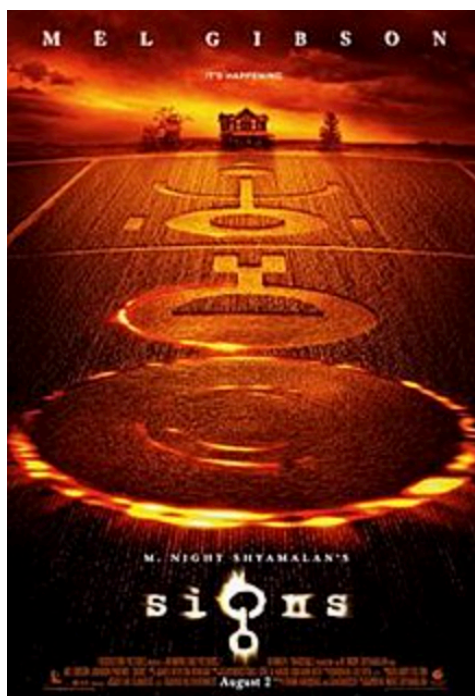

(but we haven't) I wish I was (formal: were) a bit taller. (but I'm not)</p> <p>2 wish + would is used to express a wish for something to change in the present or future.</p> <p>• We often use it to criticise or complain about someone or something: I wish Peter would wear smarter clothes. I wish the weather would improve.</p> <p>• I wish + would cannot be used to refer to oneself: I wish I could (not would) stop smoking. (but I can't)</p> <p>• We cannot use would for an impossible change: If only the earth would be flat. (formal: were) square.</p> <p>Note Notice the difference between wish and hope. If we hope something will happen, we believe it is possible and likely: I hope they will come. (= I want them to and I think it's likely) I wish they would come. (= I don't believe it's likely.)</p>	<p>3 We use wish / if only + past perfect to express regret about a past situation: I wish we'd had something to eat earlier. (but we didn't) If only I hadn't missed my appointment. (but I did)</p> <p>4 Differences between wish and if only:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • if only is usually more emphatic than I wish. • We can put a subject between if and only for emphasis: If only you / If you only knew what I've been going through. <p>B It's time</p> <p>We use this expression to say that something is not happening and it should be: It's (high) time you gave up playing computer games. (You should give them up!)</p> <p>C would rather/sooner, would prefer</p> <p>I'd rather / I'd sooner you didn't ask me for any more money. (Please don't!)</p> <p>I'd prefer it if you didn't ask me for any more money.</p> <p>Notes</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If the speaker and the preference are the same, we use an infinitive, not the past tense: I'd rather/sooner watch TV. (not to watch) I'd prefer to watch TV. (not watch) • We can also say I'd prefer you not to go. <p>D as if / as though</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We use the past after as if / as though to indicate that the situation is unlikely: He acts as if/though he was (formal: were) a teenager. (In fact, he's in his thirties.) • We use a present tense to indicate that something is likely: He looks as if/though he is a teenager. (And he probably is.) <p>E suppose/supposing, imagine, what if</p> <p>We use these expressions to ask about an imaginary situation in the present or future, and its possible consequences: (Just) suppose/supposing/imagine you won the lottery, how would you spend the money? What if you had hurt yourself – what would have happened then?</p> <p>Module 8</p> <p>1 Emphasis (page 124)</p> <p>A Emphasis using negative introductory expressions</p> <p>The following expressions can be placed first in a sentence for emphasis. The subject and verb are then inverted. We use do/did/would if there is no auxiliary:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • little, never, rarely, scarcely: Never have I seen so many people. Little did we know that he had followed us. • no sooner... than, hardly/hardly... when: No sooner had he got the job than he asked for a pay rise. Hardly had I got through the door when the phone rang.
