A lot of job/s/work.

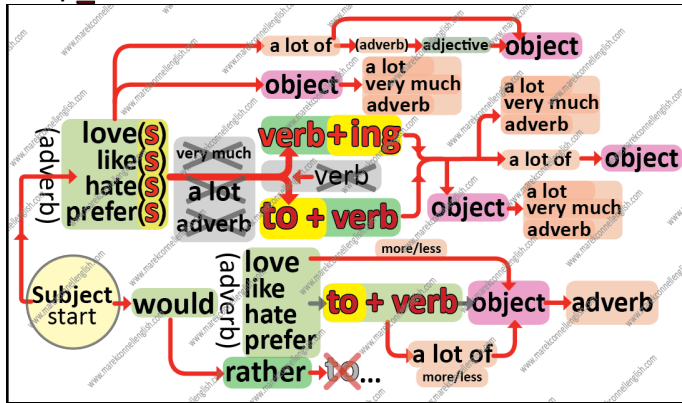
