


account for
phrasal verb of account

- give a satisfactory record of (something, typically money, that one is responsible for).
"I had to account for every penny I spent"
- provide or serve as a satisfactory explanation for.
"he was brought before the Board to account for his behaviour"
synonyms: **explain**, give an explanation, come up with an explanation, explain away, answer for, give reasons for, **rationalize**, provide a rationale for, show grounds for, **elucidate**, **illuminate**, clear up; **More**
- know the fate or whereabouts of (someone or something), especially after an accident.
"everyone was accounted for after the floods"
- succeed in killing, destroying, or defeating.
"a mishit drive accounted for Jones, who had scored 32"
synonyms: dispose of, finish off, make an end of, deal with, put paid to, take care of, clear up, mop up, **eliminate**, **kill**, **destroy**, **dispatch**, put out of action, **incapacitate**
"its awe-inspiring whirlpool has accounted for many sailors' lives"
- supply or make up (a specified amount or proportion).
"social security accounts for about a third of total public spending"
synonyms: **constitute**, make up, **comprise**, **form**, **compose**, be responsible for, **represent**, **supply**, **provide**, **give**
"excise duties account for over half the price of Scotch"

the fact or quality of being alike; resemblance.
"her likeness to him was astonishing"
synonyms: resemblance, similarity,
