Book binding

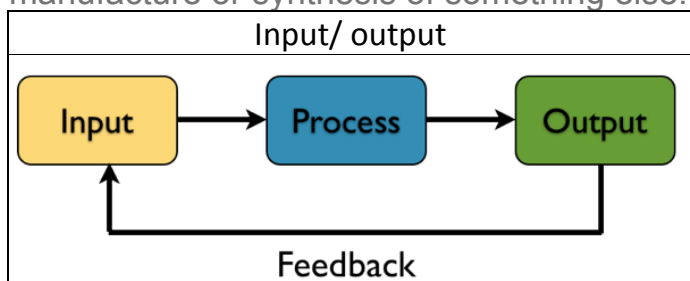
