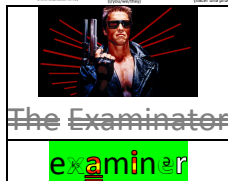




Remember + to + verb (acuerdate) You remember to do something before you do it. Remember/forget + to + infinitive means that you remember something you have/had to do – a duty or a chore. "Remember to close the door" "Don't forget to post that letter for me." "Did you remember to post that letter for me?" "Remember to do your homework." "Don't forget..." "He remembered to do his homework."	→ future
Remind me to + verb (Recuerda me) "Remember to do your homework" "My wife reminds (reminded) me to clean the bird cage". "My assistant reminds me to book English class."	→ future
Remember (+ verb+ing) (acordarse) You remember doing something after you have done it. "I remember having dinner when the World trade centres were attacked" "I remember sending him the email." "I'll always remember meeting you for the first time." "I'll never forget meeting you for the first time."	← past
Object¹ + remind(s) me of object² (me recuerdas a..) "Marek reminds me of Will Smith" "these puppets remind me of sesame street." "I wrote to them to remind them of our agreement"	↓ now

What's the Difference?

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REMEMBER

this refers to your memory, it's about information that you hold and you store in your memory

Do you remember the holiday we had two years ago?



REMIND

causes someone to think of something, to make someone remember something

The weather today reminds me of that holiday.



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What's the difference between

remember and

remind ?

We use *remember* when we are thinking about things in the past:
I *remember* going to the beach.

Sometimes it means "not forget":
Remember to get some bread.

Remind means "make someone remember something". We always say *who* is being reminded:

Tom *reminded her* to go to the bank.

Remember me to phone Jo. ✗
