become into +object

If you convert A **into** B, then A generally becomes B.
 'Convert to' is used more generally.
 You can convert a car **to** LP gas (to use LP gas), or but you can't convert it **into** LP gas.
 You can convert (change) a \$10 note **to** two \$5 notes; but it's illegal to try to convert it **into** two \$5s.
